Summary

The Director of Music will serve the church by organizing and presenting a high-quality, dynamic, and diverse music program. They will direct, rehearse, coordinate, and supervise staff and volunteers to further this progressive religion, building upon the church's well-established, respected music tradition.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Working closely with the ministerial staff, the Director of Music will program a broad range of music to help create and sustain meaningful worship experiences for Sunday morning services and additional special services, including weddings and memorials. This includes recruiting, auditioning, and directing adult choirs; supervising and coordinating other music associates, choir directors, and accompanists; and guiding the children's choir director to develop a high-quality children's choir program. In addition to the choral programs, the director will recruit church members and invited guests to contribute other musical offerings, showcasing a wide range of musical styles, genres, cultures, composers, and countries of origin, representing the many types of congregants participating in worship in the sanctuary and online each week (current average combined attendance of 600 to 700 individuals).

The Director of Music's administrative duties include preparing an annual music budget; monitoring and creatively utilizing restricted funds; monitoring the purchase, maintenance, and replacement of instruments, music-related equipment, and supplies (including the pianos and pipe organ); selecting and purchasing music for all ensembles; and recruiting and managing volunteers to help maintain the music library. As part of the worship team, the Director of Music will participate in regularly scheduled church staff meetings.

Qualifications

- A graduate music degree
- 5 years of experience in a similar position
- Background in successful choral conducting
- Excellent keyboard skills (the church uses a Walker 19-rank, 25-stop tracker action organ in the sanctuary; there are two Steinway grand pianos available).
- The ability to competently perform each essential duty

- Lead volunteers and guest performers with enthusiasm and kindness
